

Local doctors come together for free cancer screening

Just because you can't feel it, doesn't mean it isn't there.

More than 50,000 Americans were diagnosed with cancers of the head and neck last year. Unfortunately, many Americans do not recognize the symptoms of these life-threatening diseases – which include cancers of the oral cavity, larynx and pharynx – and by the time they are diagnosed, for some, it's too late.
